In the early fourth century, the Romsn Empire was torn by civil war. Two candidates for emperor, Constantine and Maxentius were about to meet in a decisive battle. The night before the *battle*, Constantine saw a vision in the sky: a great cross with the legend "in hoc signo vinces. "in this sign you shall conquer" This Latin inscription still shows up on churches, altar clothes, vestments and on some crosses. You might sometimes see the letters HIS in the same places, but the letters are not directly related. They are not Latin, but Greek, an abbreviation of the Holy Nmae.

Constantine won the battle and regarded the sign as devine. Because of that he took a great interest in Christianity. After his death, Constantine's mother, Helena, decided that the True Cross should be found. She toured the Holy Land and ordered careful excavation of the hill of Golgotha, where according to tradition, the True Cross of the crucifixion had been buried on the first Good Friday. She was ecstatic when the excavations turned up a well preserved cross, despite being buried for 280 years in the dry soil. But then they found two other crosses/. Helena was convinced that these were the crosses of Christ and the two thieves crucified with Him. But which was Christ's Cross? Helena halted a funeral that was passing by. A young college student from a school in a Midwestern state heard that we sometimes gave room and board to people who came to Atmore to visit inmates on death row. The girl, Madonna (her real name), called us and asked if we would let her stay for two or three days to visit a pen pal on the 'row'. After a few questions we agreed to let her stay with us. She was going to post a note on her Dorm bulletin board, in an attempt to find a ride to the Atmore area.

On the day of her arrival, she came into the drive in an old car, whose driver was dressed in much the same style as she was, straight out of the 60's & 70's. Flower children in all their glory. This was in the early 90's. She couldn't visit her prison pal until the next day, so we spent a pleasant day in conversation and getting to know each other. Following her visit to Death Row the next day, we talked about her friend while having dinner

Basically she was against the death penalty and thought that killing a person was wrong regardless of the reason. Later in the conversation, the subject of abortion came up. Here, her views changed. She felt that a woman had the right to terminate a pregnancy if she wanted to, even without a reason. We asked her to explain her double standard. Why was it wrong to kill an adult, but not wrong to kill an unborn child who had yet to take their first breath of air. "Think about it." We said Madonna decided that she needed some time alone and went for a walk. She returned an hour or so later, her eyes red and glistening with tears. She fell into our arms and sobbed. "Now I know the real reason I came to Atmore. Thank you." She said. She left the next day and we never heard from her again. Maybe she has a new outlook on life and on death. Only she and God know.

GEOGRAPHIC FACTS

(Stuff you really need to know)

Alaska

More than half of the coastline of the entire United States is in Alaska .

Amazon

The Amazon rainforest produces more than 20% the world's oxygen supply. The Amazon River pushes so much water into the Atlantic Ocean that, more than one hundred miles at sea off the mouth of the river, one can dip fresh water out of the ocean. The volume of water in the Amazon river is greater than the next eight largest rivers in the world combined and three times the flow of all rivers in the United States.

Antarctica

Antarctica is the only land on our planet that is not owned by any country. Ninety percent of the world's ice covers Antarctica. This ice also represents seventy percent of all the fresh water in the world. As strange as it sounds,

however, Antarctica is essentially a desert. The average yearly total precipitation is about two inches Although covered with ice (all but 0.4% of it, ice.), Antarctica is the driest place on the planet, with an absolute humidity lower than the Gobi desert.
