I look forward to seeing you all at the upcoming clausura for the Men's and Women's weekends. Those working the team and attending clausura will begin to see pieces of the Step-By-Step guide being implemented.

One of the areas we will begin with is the transportation of the new Cursillistas. When possible, Candidates will ride to the Retreat Center with a team member (preferably one they do not know) from their area. This will allow the team member(s) and Candidates to get to know each other along the way and hopefully arrive together. If there are too many new Cursillistas from one area for a vehicle or if there are no team members from an area, the sponsor will be responsible for ensuring the new Cursillista have transportation to and from the sites. The Rector(a) and Service Team Boss will help with the transportation arrangements of the new Cursillistas if the sponsor and team members need assistance.

Spring and future weekends will be conducted as outlined in the Cursillo Manual (2007, third edition). Following the Manual's outline will bring us closer to the implementation of the Step-by-Step guide once it is published

Per the Manual, Mass will be at 11:00 am (not at the end of the day and will be open to the community. At the end of the day, you (the Fourth Day Community) will be invited into the chapel and the Clausura will begin.

The format from previous Clausura will be followed with a few adjustments. A Decuria (table family) representative will present an overview of the weekend for their table family. If their table family wishes to share, they will be able to. Next, a guest speaker gives a witness about living the 4th Day. At the conclusion of the witness, team members can share their thoughts if they wish.

Upon the completion of sharing, the Apostolic Commitment Service sheets will be returned. The new Cursillistas will then be presented their crucifixes. The Spiritual Director will close with a prayer and the community will join together singing De Colores as we joyfully exit the chapel.

What is palanca?

What is a palanca letter? A palanca letter is one that is sent to the candidates and team, informing them of the prayers and sacrifices that you are offering to God on their behalf. A letter may be sent explaining what type of palanca is being offered, but the letter is NOT the palanca. The actual palanca is the action—intercessory prayer, sacrifice, or works of mercy—and it can be done without writing a letter.


