You may find this an odd title for a Cursillo article, but it really envelops what I believe is at the heart of some of the issues with the Mobile movement since I lived my Cursillo in 2004. Yes, that 3-day weekend changed my life, and my 4th day has been a mixture of blessings and struggles. As my husband Jeff says "The 98% is really good...it's that 2% that will get you." Focus is our "2%."

The Weekend is the focus of most Cursillistas. We wrongly "recruit" people to come to a weekend retreat (many times at the last minute) instead of living our command of "Make a friend. Be a friend. Bring a friend to Christ." These, like the three legs of our Cursillo stool, cannot stand without another.. If we "make a friend" by saying hello at church or in our community, but do no more, are we truly making a friend? 'Hello' may be the opening of the door to making, and then being, a friend. Being a friend means getting to know that person: their family, their likes, their hobbies, their interests, etc. If we can do that then we can possibly bring a friend to Christ – and not by inviting them to a 3-day weekend but through the example of us living our 4th day. As Cursillistas, we live our 4th day in community reflected in our small groups, Ultreya, and School of Leaders.

Each part of our structure (Precursillo, Cursillo, Postcursillo) is as important as the other in our growth as Cursillistas. As we grow in holiness, we grow in the gifts of the Holy Spirit (wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord) as well as the fruits of the Holy Spirit (love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and (continued on page 3)

Therefore we need to correct our focus. Let's start by making sure that every Cursillista who wants to be in a small group is given that opportunity. If you have small group brothers or sisters who have not come in a while, invite them back. If you are the person who wants to group but hasn't been able to, reach out to your previous group, Ultreya leader or a Secretariat member.

Next, let's LIVE our 4th day. We can now experience community as we feel comfortable. We can re-start Ultreyas. We can invite others to our small groups and Ultreyas so that they can meet the Christ in each of us as we LIVE our 4th day. We can share our ideas at School and learn more so that we can share more.

Once we are living our 4th day completely, we will attract others to the movement because, like me those many years ago, they will want to know the source of joy shining in the faces of active Christians who are Cursillistas. Let us not focus so much on one part of Cursillo that the rest is lost and <u>out of focus</u>. Together, let's get back to a 20/20 vision of the movement, its charism and its joy!

Retreat to Go Forward

A recommendation for spiritual growth is to make an annual retreat. There are many reasons that retreats are important! They help us to remove ourselves from the familiarity of our usual patterns or surroundings, to set aside time to get away with God in His Creation. Often at different points in life, one reason or need may outweigh another. However, there are always valid reasons, no matter what your season of life, that a retreat is very important to schedule, plan, and attend. We, humans, are created to commune with God and with one another. Spending time sequestered in an atmosphere of growth and vulnerability can allow God to move in lives.

"Jesus often withdrew Himself into the wilderness to pray" Luke 5:16

The Greek word for 'withdraw' means to retire, go back, to *retreat*. We read of Jesus calling his disciples away to retreat at a very volatile and possibly overwhelming point at the beginning of their journey. "When the apostles returned, they reported to Jesus what they had done. Then he took them with him and they withdrew by themselves to a town called Bethsaida..." Luke 9:10

What is interesting is that just before being whisked away to withdraw, we read of the disciples informing Jesus of the beheading of John and shortly after this retreat together Jesus feeds the 5000. It is no coincidence that the Son of God Himself sequestered His followers to rest after hearing such devastating news. But also, to prepare for the faith-stretching and physically taxing calling of feeding 5000 people who were in search of answers. He knew that they needed rest to have the ability to feed that crowd. A miracle which helped to prepare the hearts of the crowd for the Words from their long-awaited Messiah! What an honor!

Both the Son of God and these normal human disciples needed to rest first and then focus - so Jesus Himself led them away to retreat.

We need to unplug and refocus. It's widely recognized that we rely upon our phones, screens, and gadgets to function in this century. And while some of them are useful tools, even to catapult Spiritual growth (devotion apps, podcasts, etc.) they often also have distractions that interject through that same tool no matter how hard we try not to allow the invasion. A retreat offers more real face to face time. A retreat offers more one on one time. A retreat offers more undistracted time to hear God's Still Small Voice. Even if the tool of WiFi is available, community, fellowship and His Creation cries out louder in a retreat setting when we unplug and refocus.

To-do lists and deadlines are just a fact of life. We spend our time 'doing life' and often this life, like herding cats, can overwhelm our spirit with all the things (even good things) on our lists and calendars. Not to mention the things that jump on our plate without warning. Pulling away on purpose to retreat from life's pressure or rut once in a while is a healthy way to balance priorities and seek His Wisdom to put things into a proper perspective. Perhaps you and your group mates can consider retreating together. Whether alone or with others, Jesus invites us ...Come away with me and rest awhile...(Mark 6:31).
